St Marks Church Of England Primary School Collective Worship Policy

**St Mark's is a Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School.
Our Collective Worship is based on Christian Values and in line with the
Beliefs and Practices of the Church of England.**

1 Aims and purpose

1.1 The aims and purpose of Collective Worship are:

- to provide an opportunity for the whole school community to worship God together;
- to enable the whole school community to consider spiritual and moral issues;
- to enable the whole school community to explore their own beliefs;
- to encourage participation and response through prayer, opportunities and seasonal reflection;
- to develop in the whole school community a sense of community spirit;
- to promote a common ethos with shared values and to reinforce positive attitudes;
- to offer guidance to help children in the practice and meaning of worship.

2 Collective Worship

2.1 We understand worship to be a special act or occasion whose purpose is to show reverence to God. Collective Worship involves all members of the school coming together and participating in an assembly.

2.2 In line with the 1988 Education Reform Act, which states that Collective Worship should be 'wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character', we base our assemblies on the teachings of Christ and traditions of the Christian Church. However, we conduct our assemblies in a manner that is sensitive to the individual faith and beliefs of all members of the school.

3 Organization of Collective Worship

3.1 We hold a daily act of collective worship in our school. This forms part of each morning assembly.

- 3.2** We conduct our Acts of Worship in a dignified and respectful way. We tell children that this time is a period of calm reflection. We regard it as a special time and expect children to behave in an appropriate way. We ask them to be quiet and thoughtful and to listen carefully to the teachings and participate fully in prayer and hymns. We create an appropriate atmosphere by using music and sometimes candles or other objects that act as a focal point for the attention of the children.
- 3.3** The Headteacher or other members of staff normally conduct our Acts of Worship, but on Wednesdays local clergy or other representatives of local religious groups conduct them instead. On Fridays the School Council take our 'Good Book' assembly in which we reflect on the theme of the week.
- 3.4** We take the themes of our Acts of Worship from the traditions of the Christian faith and we often reflect the festivals and events of the Christian calendar. Sometimes the themes reflect and build on topics that we teach as part of the school curriculum including SEAL. We plan our Acts of Worship as part of a series of themes well in advance of the day they take place. The main resources we use is 'Assemblies for Schools' by Margaret Cooling.
- 3.5** Our assemblies reflect the achievements and learning of the children. We encourage the children to participate in assemblies by showing their work to the other children and raising issues that they have discussed in their classes. Acts of Worship offer an opportunity to acknowledge and reward children for their achievements both in and out of schools. They play an important part in promoting the ethos of the school, which is that all children are valued and all achievements are recognised. At St Marks Primary School we celebrate the successes of all the children in assemblies – particularly in our Friday 'Good Book' assembly.
- 3.6** Parents are welcome to attend our special assemblies and the festival celebrations and other services at St Mark's Church and we encourage them to attend as this promotes the community spirit of the school and is a practical demonstration of the way the home and the school work together to support the achievements of our children.
- 3.7** We welcome governors' attendance at our Acts of Worship at any time.

4 Right of withdrawal

- 4.1** We expect all children to attend assembly. However, any parent can request permission for their child to be excused from attending religious worship and the school will make alternative arrangements for the supervision of the child during the period concerned. Parents do not have to explain or give reasons for this. This complies with the 1944 Education Act and was restated in the 1988 Education Reform Act.
- 4.2** The Headteacher keeps a record of all children who withdraw from Collective Worship.

5 Monitoring and review

5.1.1 It is the role of a named school governor with responsibility for religious education and collective worship to monitor the policy and practice of Collective Worship. The governor concerned liaises with the Headteacher before reporting to the governors on Religious Education and Collective Worship.

5.1.2 The Lead Governor for Collective Worship is Rev Dr Peter Sanlon.

6 The Role of the Subject Leader

6.1.1 The Role of the Subject Leader is to:

- devise the themes and monitor their delivery
- liaise with the Diocese of Rochester, the School Governors and St Mark's Church
- keep up to date with current ideas through reading and attending courses
- ensure that Worship is discussed regularly at staff meetings
- take responsibility for the purchase and organisation of central resources for the Act of Worship

Appendix 1

FORMAT FOR ACT OF COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

Preparation

1. Worship table draped with the appropriate coloured cloth (See Appendix 3)
2. Closed Bible. Candle ready to be lit. Wooden Cross and Prayer Box
3. Music playing – quiet and reflective
4. Prayer or Collect on the screen

Action

1. Children file in silently and sit down
2. The Peace / Response
3. Greeting (Makaton can be used)
4. Light the candle, reminding the worshippers that it represents the Light of Christ
5. Open the Bible, reminding them that it is God's Word and Story
6. Say either the Lord's Prayer or the School Prayer together
7. Song
8. Talk
9. Think About - can be read by a child
10. Prayer –can be read by a child
11. Prayer box (Wednesday only)
12. Grace / Blessing
13. Close the Bible, reminding the worshippers that we can learn from it and let it influence our lives
14. Blow the candle out, reminding them that the Light of Christ never goes out but goes with each of us
15. Notices
16. Children leave in silence listening to music or singing a song
