Year 5 expectations

Homework:

Children will receive a short piece of homework on a weekly basis. Homework will be set on Friday and will usually be due in the following Friday. Occasionally, a longer-term project will be set for children to complete over a few weeks. Homework will usually be maths or literacy based.

Spelling

Spelling lists will be handed out weekly. Children should practise spellings at regular intervals throughout the week. They will be tested on a Friday.

Reading:

Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures. In Year 5, children are expected to read for 25 minutes per night. Reading records should be signed by an adult and will be collected in every Thursday.

English

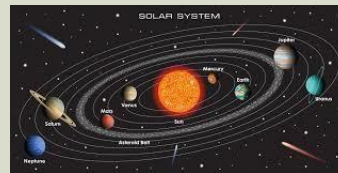
In English, the children will produce a variety of pieces of writing such as narratives, newspaper reports, a letter, an information text and poetry.
