We will be consolidating our knowledge of digraphs and trigraphs this term whilst also learning how to read and blend longer words and sentences.

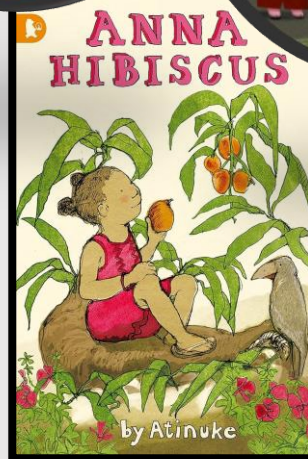
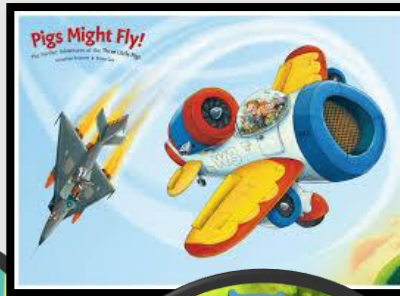
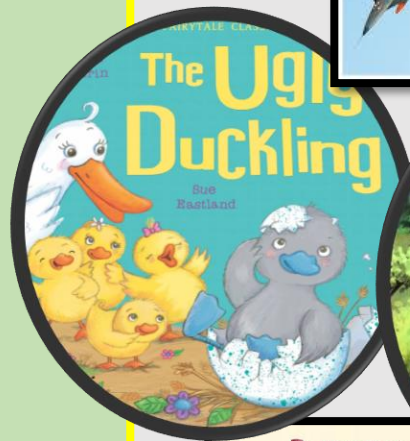
In Numbers and Patterns, we will be exploring number facts to 20, comparing, composing, decomposing, sharing and grouping bigger numbers.

Some other points...
